# **College Board Nominations**

At the last Board meeting we agreed to some minor changes to the constitution regarding the composition of the Board and the duration of each category's membership. There is no longer a past parent category, although past parents are encouraged to nominate as a community member. The Board Chair will be chosen by Board members.

The Board will now consist of the following:

School Staff Maximum of 3
Parents Maximum of 6

(2x Year 10, 2x Year 11, 2x Year 12)

Community/Partners Maximum of 3
Students Maximum of 2

**Principal** Compulsory membership

# Membership Term:

- School staff will serve a term of no more than 3 years
- Parents will serve a 1-year term and can renominate if they wish
- **Community members** will serve a 1-year term and can renominate if they wish
- **Students** are chosen from the Prefect group and attend meetings on a rotational basis

A majority of Board positions need to be filled for the 2023 year. If you would like to nominate, please complete the attached form, and return to the College via email or in person. The closing date for all categories is Monday, 27 February 2023. Should we receive more nominations than positions available, an election will be held. Newly elected members must then complete the compulsory screening process before their membership can be confirmed.

# Vaping

Research has found that some e-liquids sold as "nicotine-free" contain nicotine. Nicotine is a highly addictive and poisonous drug. E-liquids also pose a poisoning risk. Reports of combustion events and burns have been reported to WorkSafe WA.

In 2022, the DoE recognised the growing issue of vaping in schools and developed a package and set of guidelines, to assist schools to manage the problem and educate students and their families.

WA College of Agriculture – Narrogin follows the DoE procedures for reporting and managing vape related incidents. Students found to be in possession of or caught using a vape on site, or during a College related activity, may face a suspension or loss of residential privilege. It is illegal to sell vapes to friends at school or in the community and may result in police intervention.

I would like to acknowledge the manner in which all students have started the year, and give special thanks to the Student Leaders for assisting new students and setting a positive tone across the College.

# **Expression of Interest for Nomination**

The College Board meets once per term for about two hours. A remote and face to face option is available for most meetings. The Board is the peak advisory group at the college and can be involved in:

- a) Promoting the school in the community
- b) Establishing and reviewing from time to time, the school's objectives, priorities and general policy directions
- c) The planning of financial arrangements necessary to fund those objectives, priorities and directions
- d) Evaluating the school's performance in achieving them
- e) Formulating codes of conduct for students at the school
- f) Approval of a charge or contribution determined by the principal for the provision of materials, services and facilities
- g) Approval of the costs determined by the principal to be paid for participation in an extra cost optional component of the school's educational program
- h) Approval of the items determined by the principal to be supplied by a student for the student's personal use in the school's educational program
- i) Approval of an agreement or arrangement for advertising or sponsorship in relation to a government school
- j) Determining in consultation with students, their parents and staff of the school, a dress code for students when they are attending or representing the school.
- k) Advising on a general policy concerning the use in school activities of prayers, songs and material based on religious, spiritual or moral values being used in a school activity as part of religious education
- Advising on allowing time for the special religious education of students in the school, up to a total of 40 hours in a year

A school's Funding Agreement (with Schedules) is noted by the school board chair.

# 2023 Application for a student vehicle at the College

- This permission form must be completed prior to the vehicle coming on site.
- Students are only permitted to have a vehicle on site whilst they are on 'Good Standing'. In the event of them losing 'Good Standing', they will not be permitted to have any vehicle on site until they return to 'Good Standing'.
- Parents must ensure vehicles are roadworthy and licensed. It is suggested students hold at least third party car insurance in the event that they are responsible for damage to property belonging to others.
- The vehicle is for day student travel, weekend leave and holiday travel and then only with the express permission of the Deputy Principal and parents (Trips to town, etc., are NOT permitted unless for extenuating circumstances).
- No other student is to travel in the vehicle unless written approval is received from the passenger's parent and the driver's parent.
- Luggage is to be packed and unpacked in the car park immediately adjacent the residential duty room.
- Cars must be parked in the areas set aside for student parking.
- Keys to be handed to the Duty Supervisor who will lock them in the Duty Room.
- No spare vehicle keys will be kept by the student at the College.
- Day students will hand their keys into the front office on arrival once parked.

# Welcome to 2023!

It is great to see students back and ready to engage in their respective trades courses. Year 10 students will cycle through the trades sections over the course of the year, with Year 11 and 12 students undertaking their allocated and timetabled subjects for the year.

Staffing in Trades is as follows:

Mr Dean Pfitzner – HOD Trades and Furnishings Mr Mark Batt – Construction and Furnishings Mr Allan Dewing – Automotive Mr John Parker – Engineering

Parents and students are reminded and asked to follow up with their respective instructors as the first point of contact in relation to their progress, and if there are any concerns or issues that need to be addressed and resolved.

With the mid week start to the year, the students have now completed a full cycle through the Trades area. All student year groups across the Trades areas have been busy with inductions and completing safe work procedures for tools, equipment and machines. Students will continue to work through and complete the safe work procedures over the coming weeks and will be in full swing with their course work.

# **Trades Induction**

Each class in Trades over the last week, as part of the startup process for the year, has received an overall induction to the Trades area. The 'Trades Code of Conduct' was referred to and explained so all students have a clear understanding of their expectations. In summary:

- Come to class prepared each student has their laptop (once issued), pens, pencils, calculator, PPE (eye and hearing protection).
- Arrive on time.
- Be polite and courteous to peers and staff.
- Behave appropriately.
- Respect people, facilities and equipment.
- If workshop is unsupervised, wait outside for trainers/ teachers.
- Obtain permission to use tools, equipment and machines.
- Obtain permission before leaving your work area.
- Mobile phones are not to be used during the school day.

With all student abiding by the code of conduct, demonstrating a willingness to learn and aspiring to do their best, they will assist in maintaining or improving the positive reputation of the College that precedes them.

# **Personal Projects**

As part of the Engineering & Furniture Making Courses and After School Trades offerings, students will be involved in making personal projects. Parents/guardians and students need to be aware of the following College policy and procedure in relation to personal projects being undertaken:

- Students and parents/guardians negotiate with the respective instructor as to the type, style and complexity of the project to be undertaken.
- Signed parent/guardian permission received.
- 50% deposit paid before the commencement of the project.
- Once the project is complete, a final account will be raised and needs to be paid in full prior to the personal project is taken form the site.

Note that students are able to supply their own materials, with an account only being raised for incidentals and consumables.
