Year 11 Agricultural Science and Technology - Plant Investigation

This term the students have designed an experiment to investigate the impact of salt concentrations on plant germination and growth rates. They are testing low

salt and moderate salt concentrations on the success of lupins, oats and barley seedlings. The trial will hopefully survive the holiday break (and the parrots) and we will be analysing the data next term.

A huge thank you to Mr Matt Hough for assisting the Year 11 students in setting up their design and enabling the trial to occur.





OPEN DAY - 2024 INTERCOLLEGE EQUESTRIAN CHALLEGE RESULTS

The WA College of Agriculture -Narrogin hosted the Intercollege Equestrian Challenge on Open Day. The aim of the challenge is for each college to compete against each other over a variety of disciplines, gaining points throughout the day towards individual placings and the College Shield. This year, the competition was a Stockman's Challenge where riders compete in 3 phases: Stockhorse Workout, Stockman's Obstacle Course and Bushman's Barrel Race. Each phase was judged by professional external judges, Char Jones and Karene Mathews.

The Stockman Obstacle Course was ridden first. The objective of this phase is to demonstrate a rider's and horse's capacity to calmly, precisely, stylishly and regularly deal with any obstacles designed to simulate difficulties which could be encountered by a working horse. The course is a set of 10 obstacles to be completed in a set time frame. Obstacles can be done in any order and points will be deducted for going too fast. Marks are given to accuracy of completing each obstacle.

The Stockhorse Workout was ridden next. Riders had to ride a specific pattern to demonstrate their riding skills on horseback, such as accurate turns, circles and halts in walk, trot and canter in front of a judge.

And lastly, was the Bushman's Barrel Race which was a timed event where riders negotiate a gate, bending poles and a hay jump between barrels.

Tertiary Access Payment - Services Australia

A payment to help students with the cost of moving from regional or remote areas for tertiary study.

The Tertiary Access Payment (TAP) is a one off payment of up to \$5,000. It's to help eligible students with the cost of moving to study. This is for study after you've finished Year 12 or equivalent.

To get the payment you need to meet some rules. These include:

- moving from a regional or remote area for tertiary study
- starting tertiary study in the year after finishing Year 12 or equivalent.
- you need to be enrolling in at least 1 year of full-time tertiary study directly following Year 12 or equivalent.
- you need to be 22 or younger on the day you start your course and your parents' income has to be under the threshold.

Regional areas are places that aren't in or near a major city. You can check if your family home is in a regional or remote area using the Student Regional Area Search.

You can claim this payment from 1 January in your first year of tertiary study if you're moving to study, and your family home is at least 90 minutes by public transport from your place of study.

You can get the Tertiary Access Payment at the same time as other student payments, such as Youth Allowance, ABSTUDY, and the Relocation Scholarship.


